WHAT IS

NARCAN® NASAL SPRAY

NARCAN® (naloxone HCl) Nasal Spray is the first and only FDA-approved nasal form of naloxone for the emergency treatment of a [known or suspected opioid overdose](#).

NARCAN® Nasal Spray counteracts the life-threatening effects of opioid overdose. Since most accidental overdoses occur in a home setting, it was developed for first responders, as well as family, friends, and caregivers.

Opioid overdose medication: Naloxone

- FDA-approved to prevent opioid overdose
- Binds to opioid receptors and reverses the effects of the drug
- Administered as a nasal spray, IM injection, subcutaneous injection, or IV injection

Narcan Distribution

- Funding provided, by OBH, through State Targeted Response to the Opioid Crisis Grant (STR)
- Over 2,000 kits distributed to-date
- CAHSD acted as a Narcan repository for target-rich agencies (first responders, emergency departments, drug courts, shelters, treatment providers, etc.)
- Narcan is available across the District (10 clinics, serving seven parishes)
