Jeffrey N. Keller, PhD, is the Director of Quality Improvement and Adverse Events Reporting for the Louisiana Alternative Therapeutics Association (LATA) for medical cannabis in State of Louisiana. He has been appointed to the Louisiana State Board of Medical Examiners and works with its Adverse Events and Outcomes Reporting for Medical Cannabis committee. Dr. Keller’s full-time position is as a professor at the Pennington Biomedical Research Center and is the Founder and Director of its Institute for Dementia Research and Prevention and the Site Director of its Alzheimer’s Disease Cooperative Study Site. Dr. Keller’s received his doctorate in Neuroscience from the University of Kentucky in 1998. Since then he has received numerous awards and grants for his work in the neuroscience field.

Workshop Summary: Attendees will learn about various aspects of the new, emerging field of medical cannabis in Louisiana. This workshop will 1) review evidence for the use of medical cannabis, 2) review recent Louisiana legislation about medical cannabis, 3) describe FDA-approved cannabis-related products, their indications, outcomes and possible adverse reactions, 4) examine cannabis as an alternative to opioids for pain management, and 5) outline the implications of medical cannabis in behavioral health settings.

Brandi Kelly, PhD (Philosophy in Psychology, LSU), serves as the Clinical Director for the Louisiana Office for Citizens with Developmental Disabilities, Louisiana Department of Health. Dr. Kelly has worked extensively providing support planning, staff training, and behavioral health services to individuals with developmental disabilities and has published research on assessment/treatment of behavioral health concerns of individuals with developmental disabilities.

Amy Greer, PhD (Philosophy in Psychology, UNO), who serves as Associate Clinical Director for the Louisiana Office for Citizens with Developmental Disabilities, Louisiana Department of Health. Dr. Greer has worked extensively in Louisiana and Texas in both community and psychiatric treatment programs providing behavioral health services, staff training, support planning to individuals with developmental disabilities, and community safety-net programs supporting persons with dual diagnosis, as well as autism spectrum disorders.

Workshop Summary: This workshop will educate social workers, licensed professional counselors, and other professionals about adjusting behavioral health interventions for individuals with Intellectual/Developmental Disability (IDD) and Co-Occurring Mental Health Needs. Attendees will learn about diagnostic considerations, preparation for therapy, modification considerations that apply across therapeutic approaches, and approaches and modifications that lead to effectiveness with individuals with IDD.
